Course description:	 Organization of Enterprises includes the basic parts of the organization of business enterprises, both in the internal organizational aspect and the external organizational aspect. In terms of content, the subject includes: Organization, concepts, principles and process of organization Formal and informal organization in the enterprise Organization of work and organizational structures of enterprises Organizational culture, conflicts in the organization, power and authority, departmentalization and control in the enterprise. The organization, operation and management of different types of business enterprises according to the legal form and according to the form of ownership. 	
Course objectives:	The course aims to provide advanced knowledge, to enable students to use specific concepts of theories and methods for the organization of business enterprises. It is among the basic subjects of the formation of the person who will work in management positions from the simplest to the highest, in the field of production and services, in the field of finance, etc., as in the entrepreneurship sector.
